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OUR STORY:

Our first step in ensuring we can help Veteran families during the Holiday season begins right here with our own Laketec Family.

During the year, we offer 'Jeans Friday' which allows our employees to wear Jeans on Fridays for a \$5 contribution to our Adopt-A-Veteran Family fund. This allows us to start building our fund beginning January 1st of every year.

We offer two different options for employees to contribute. First is a 'Payroll Contribution' option – which has turned out to be extremely successful. Employees sign up to have a deduction made directly from their paycheck, making it easier for them to contribute in a day and age where cash is rarely carried. Other employees still prefer to pay cash as they go. Either way, it is a wonderful way to start building a good foundation for the program.

These funds are used to purchase toys, gifts and clothing for each family. To put a star on the tree, our President and his wife, Joe and Kim Little, match the employee contribution dollar for dollar. The match provides an abundance of necessities for the family such as food, dry goods, household needs and so much more.

There are many other ways to lend support that doesn't require our employees to participate in the 'Jeans Friday' program. As their contribution, many employees prefer to purchase an item from the list of needs and wishes from the family. We have one employee whose mom loves getting involved by providing beautifully handcrafted poinsettias and wreaths for each family.

From there, we begin our mission with a series of team-building and holiday spirit-based activities to maximize our employee involvement. We do everything from an ugly holiday sweater contest, sharing of baked goods and even a soup cook-off where the winner receives our coveted Soup Bowl Trophy.

LATE NOVEMBER/EARLY DECEMBER

Wish/Needs List of Families

- VA contact provides list of families encompassing the following:
 - Branch of service
 - Number of children and adults including ages and gender
 - Wants, needs and wishes (including clothing sizes)
 - Method of contact
- Internal committee member reaches out to families for the following:
 - Fill in any gaps regarding sizes, ages, gender, etc.
 - Obtain address for delivery
 - Schedule delivery date/time
- Organize list and post internally for employees who prefer to donate through purchasing items.

The Marines & Toys for Tots

Reach out to local Toys for Tots to obtain toys/bikes, etc. to fill in some of the items on list.
Generally, the Marines will allow one toy or bike per child, which is very helpful.

Shopping

- Deploy teams to purchase items in different areas:
 - Clothing
 - Toys
 - Household goods
 - Food

o Organize & Wrap

- Organize all items by family
- Label all wrapped toys/gift bag by family member
- Enlist employees for a "Wrapping Party" to ensure all toys, gifts and clothing are wrapped and ready for delivery.

WEEK BEFORE CHRISTMAS

Delivery:

- Committee member reaches back out to family to confirm delivery
- Pack up the sleigh and head out to put smiles on the faces of a very deserving family! We typically have 10 15 of our elves go out and help deliver. This is another great way to build camaraderie while giving back to the community.
